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Introduction

Today, there is a great shortage of leadership all over the world. This is true in government, business, the family, and society as a whole. However, there is also a great shortage of leadership in the church. The purpose of this manual is to look at the Biblical principles for being godly spiritual leaders and developing effective godly leaders in the church.

The world has placed a strong focus on solving the problems of society. In order to solve those problems, the world has become problem-focused. It reacts to problems. It then tries to develop policies to avoid those problems. In order to make certain that the policies are carried out, the world has developed an elaborate reporting system. This has changed the focus from people to tasks. As a result, those who are in positions of leadership focus on telling people what to do. Then, they try to tell them how to do it their way which destroys our God-given creativity. In order to do this telling, the world has focused on written instructions which are carried out through a chain of command. The primary goal has been to increase the productivity or efficiency and complete the task. In order to carry out this problem-centered focus, the world has placed a strong emphasis on administration instead of leadership.

The church has followed the pattern of the world so that most churches and church organizations are now focused on maintenance rather than obedience to the Great Commission. Proverbs 14:12 and Proverbs 16:25 both say, "There is a way *that seems* right to a man, but its end *is* the way of death." This has resulted in a strong emphasis on administration rather than leadership in many churches and church organizations. The chart on the next page will show the style of Christ in comparing leadership and administration. The eleven topics mentioned on that page provide the eleven topics that are covered in this manual.





"Go(ing) therefore, **Make Disciples** of all the nations, <u>baptizing</u> them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, <u>teaching</u> them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and, lo, I am with you always, *even* to the end of the age.' Amen."

1. our commission has one command

Make Disciples

2. our commission has three participles which tell how to carry out that command

going

this is going to people, sharing the Gospel with them, and leading them to Christ

baptizing

this is helping those people to identify with Christ and with a local body of believers

teaching

this is showing those people how to obey Christ and grow to spiritual maturity

II. Effective Leadership Develops A Plan of Action

A. Christ chose to develop disciples through love John 13:1

Christ loved His own who were in the world

Christ loved His own to the end

Love is defined in 1 Corinthians 13:4-7

1. love has two major characteristics:

love is patient

love is kind

2. love has eight things it does not do:

love does not envy (is not jealous)

love does not brag love does not become proud

love does not behave rudely love does not seek its own way

love is not provoked love does not think evil

love does not rejoice in iniquity but rejoices in the truth

3. love has four things it does:

love bears all things love hopes all things

love believes all things love endures all things

4. love never fails

B. Christ sent those disciples to develop others through love John 17:9-19

Christ prayed for the disciples
Christ set the disciples apart to God for His holy purposes
Christ sent the disciples as He had been sent

1. disciples are developed either through fear or love 1 John 4:18-19

"There is no fear in love; but perfect love casts out fear, because fear involves torment. But he who fears has not been made perfect in love. We love Him because He first loved us."

John 10:10

Satan came to steal, kill and destroy

Christ came to give abundant life

2. disciples are motivated by love 2 Corinthians 5:14-15

For the love of Christ compels us; because we judge thus: that if One died for all, then all died; and He died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves, but for Him who died for them and rose again.

Christ loves each of us
Christ showed that love by dying for us
Christ gives us the opportunity to respond to that love

3. disciples are helped toward maturity through love 1 Thessalonians 2:7-12

the disciples showed the love of a nursing mother the disciples provided the example of a caring father


C. Christ calls us to develop disciples through love John 13:34-35

Christ says this a commandment not a suggestion


Christ says we are to love one another as He loves us

III. Effective Leadership Builds Relationships

1. Christ built relationships by going to an woman who was an outcast John 4:4-42

Christ initiated conversation with the woman



3. Christ focused on what the fishermen would become Luke 5:8-11



B. Christ developed transformed people Acts 4:13


"Now when they saw the boldness of Peter and John, and perceived that they were uneducated and untrained men, they marveled. And they realized that they had been with Jesus."


V. Effective Leadership Focuses on the People Being Led

B. Christ helped friends become brethren John 20:17

Christ called the disciples brethren Christ sent messages to His brethren

Christ lifted the disciples from the level of servants to brethren The word "brethren" is used over 300 times in the New Testament (most times it is used to refer to Christian brothers)

A master-servant relationship looks like this Ephesians 6:5-6

"Bondservants, be obedient to those who are *your* masters according to the flesh, with fear and trembling, in sincerity of heart, as to Christ; not with eyeservice, as menpleasers, but as bondservants of Christ, doing the will of God from the heart."



A friendship relationship looks like this John 15:15


"No longer do I call you servants, for the servant does not know what his master is doing; but I have called you friends, for all things that I heard from My Father I have made known to you."



A brethren relationship looks like this 1 John 3:16, 4:11

"By this we know love, because He laid down his life for us. And we ought to lay down our lives for the brethren."

"Beloved, if God so loved us, we ought also to love one another."



- ♦ spiritual toddlers are tossed to and fro by every false teaching Ephesians 4:14
- ♦ spiritual toddlers are easily deceived by false teachers Ephesians 4:14
- ♦ spiritual toddlers are dull of hearing to spiritual truth Hebrews 5:11
- ♦ spiritual toddlers need to be retaught the basics of Christianity Hebrews 5:12

VIII. Effective Leadership Focuses on Informal Communication

A. Christ listened to the disciples Mark 6:7-13, 30-31

IX. Effective Leadership is Servant Leadership


A. Christ said we lead by serving Mark 10:42-45

B. Christ said we lead by loving Him John 21:15-17

1. effective godly leadership is not based on:

natural leadership skills, programs, methods or anything else

effective godly leadership is based on loving Christ

2. effective godly leadership

focuses on feeding young Christians focuses on providing shepherding ministries focuses on feeding the maturing Christians

3. effective shepherding ministries Isaiah 40:11; Ezekiel 34:1-16

an effective shepherd feeds His flock
an effective shepherd provides protection to young Christians
an effective shepherd gently leads Christians who are leading others
an effective shepherd strengthens the diseased (those affected by false teaching)
an effective shepherd strengthens the sick (those affected by sinful living)
an effective shepherd helps the sheep lie in a good fold (fellowship)
an effective shepherd brings back those that are driven away
an effective shepherd binds up the broken
an effective shepherd seeks the lost

C. Christ calls us to serve one another in love Galatians 5:13

Christians have been called to liberty
Christians are not to use that liberty to satisfy the flesh
Christians now have liberty to serve one another in love

1. basic attitudes for effective servant leadership Philippians 2:3-4

"Let nothing be done through selfish ambition or conceit, but in lowliness of mind let each esteem others better than himself. Let each of you look out not only for his own interests, but also for the interest of others."

we are to do nothing out of strife (putting self forward)
we are to do nothing out of vainglory (pride)
we are to have a humble opinion of ourselves
we are to consider others better than ourselves
we are not to look out for our own best interests
we are to look out for the best interests of others

2. basic actions for effective servant leadership 1 Peter 4:10-11

"As each one has received a gift, minister it to one another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God. If anyone speaks, *let him speak* as the oracles of God. If anyone ministers, *let him do it* as with the ability which God supplies, that in all things God may be glorified through Jesus Christ, to whom belong the glory and the dominion forever and ever. Amen."

we are to speak the Word of God when we speak we are to serve with the ability that God gives as we serve

X. Effective Leadership Focuses on Teamwork

A. Christ chose a team to be with Him Mark 3:13-14

Christ chose to work through people
Christ chose the people through whom He would work
Christ chose to spend much time with His team
Christ chose to train His team by example

Basic principle for choosing a leadership team: Look for "FAT" people



The Great Commandment Mark 12:30-31


